Recommended Dish: Fried Mussel Omelet

If you don't know Pad Thai, you probably don't know Thai food. Besides the many familiar dishes of Thai food you can enjoy at La Maison Samorn, what you will find special here in the menu is **Fried mussel omelet**. It is commonly found in Bangkok's street food, and usually paired well with Pad Thai. All you need is mussels, eggs, tapioca flour, cooking oil

and seasoning. Top with fresh bean sprouts and sprinkle with Sriracha sauce. This crispy recipe is great as either an appetizer or a main dish. Add a glass of chilled Thai beer, it will be completed. If you don't want to sweat it out, simply order this signature dish from La Maison Samorn and you won't be disappointed, particularly that Mme. Samorn always adds her secret weapon in every of her dish and that is love.

Recommended Dish: Chicken Satay

Among many popular items ordered by customers, the highlight is on an appetizer called **Satay** (Skewers of marinated pork or chicken). The tenderness of the grilled chicken and the bursting flavour of the marinate come from the goodness of fresh Thai herbs and ingredients, namely, lemongrass, cilantro root, turmeric, and fish sauce. It is served with the piquant peanut sauce which is made with red curry paste, coconut milk, and freshly ground peanut which is a perfect combination for this aromatic snack that is wildly popular in Thailand as well as in Canada.
